## Hints from the Judges:

- Take blighted petals off, leave a few leaves on.
- Take off extra buds on "Rose Bud" or single bloom category.
- Remove diseased leaves or leaves with holes.
- Rose buds must be open a little to show colour of opening petals coming from centre.
- Cut Coleus 3 days before needed. Immerse stems in water to prevent drooping on judging day.
- Insert small wad of newspaper behind single stem to make stem firm and prevent container from falling over.
- Bowl – round container, is wider than is high and must be viewed from all round.
- Protea is NOT native to Australia. Geraldton Wax is a native of Western Australia.
- Single Flower Category – the flower must be dominant. Not the foliage.
- Specimen is a SINGLE stem.
- Distinct means different colours, or different type of.
