All exhibitors to pay normal admission fee to showgrounds on show days

All exhibits must be of marketable standards, and have stems attached.

Stewards will be at the Showgrounds on Thursday 7th May between 4:00pm and 6:30pm to accept entries with completed Entry Forms.

No exhibit will be accepted unless the Entry Fee has been paid and Entry Form is completed.

A new class will be created for any produce not already listed, provided there are two or more entries.

- All chaff to be not less than 12 kg. Trusses of hay to be not less than 12 kg.
 - Bundles of grasses to be 75 mm to 100 mm diameter, ends blunt cut, tied with baling twine at 3 intervals up stems to 30 cm from ends.
 - Classes Two/ Three - Pumpkins, Melons, Corn etc - need to be similar in shape and size.
 - Tropical Legumes – 3 varieties (NB. Lucerne is a legume but not a tropical legume, if added need 3 tropical also)
 - Honey – 250 gram - Honey with comb – 250 gram (jar must be full)
 - **New** Living Garden in a Painted Polystyrene Box - 30 x 60 cm max. Selection of plants up to 15 cm high. Paint a design on the box. **Please water day prior - NOT day of entry**
- Judging is Friday morning.

Exhibits to be collected between 5.00 – 5.30 pm Saturday 9th May 2020.

No Responsibility taken for any produce not collected.

NO PRODUCE TO BE TAKEN BEFORE 5.00 pm. Produce to be handed out by Chief Steward.
